Rachel Tattersall

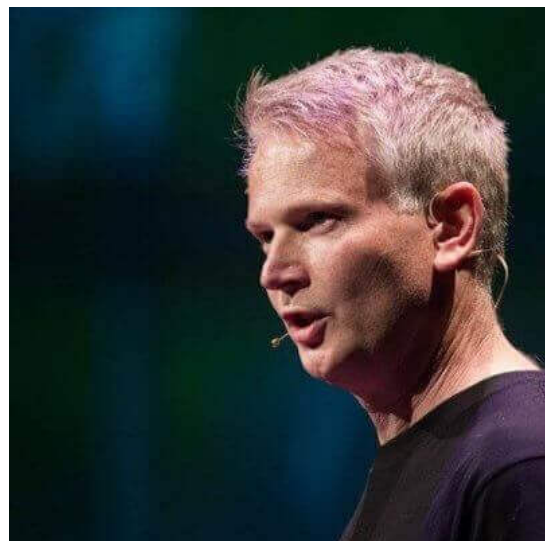
